

2 DIE HERE AS CYCLE DIVES IN PATH OF AUTO

Des Moines Youth,
Zearing Man
Killed.

Two young men riding on a motorcycle with which one of them had just safely completed a 4,000 mile trip, were killed Monday afternoon when they careened into the path of an approaching automobile.

The victims were Robert See, 23, of 2509 E. Twenty-fourth st., driver of the motorcycle, and Cy Andrews, 30, of Zearing, Ia.

The accident occurred on Euclid ave., where E. Twenty-second st. extended, would intersect.

"Like a Bullet."

Vernon Eaton, 28, of Newton, Ia., who was driving east on Euclid ave., (highway 6), said the motorcycle came over a slight hill several hundred feet ahead of him "like a bullet" and weaving from one side of the road to the other. Eaton said he drove partly off the pavement in an effort to avoid the motorcycle, but just as it reached him it tipped sideways and the men fell heading into the left front end of his car.

The impact of their bodies crippled his steering mechanism and he stopped his car 137 feet ahead on the north side of the highway.

The riderless motorcycle continued on for 200 feet and fell at the south side of the street.

Third in Family.

Neither Mr. Eaton nor his wife, who was riding with him at the time of the accident, was injured, although both suffered shock.

The death of See was the third fatality in the family due to auto accidents in three months.

Elmer See, 18, East High school student, and brother of Robert, was killed when struck by an automobile Apr. 12 while he was walking home from church on Euclid ave. at the Rock Island underpass, about two blocks west of where Monday's accident occurred.

William See, uncle of the two young men, was killed when an automobile struck him as he was riding a bicycle at Ventura, Cal.

Robert See and his father had just returned from the funeral in California a few hours before on the same motorcycle which See rode to his death.

"Doesn't Seem Possible."

"It doesn't seem possible," the father of the fatally injured youth said. "I just finished riding 4,000 miles with Robert and we didn't have the slightest mishap."

Andrews had been a close friend of the uncle who was killed in California and he had come to Des Moines to visit the Sees after bearing of William See's death. Monday Robert See offered to take Andrews home. They were en route to Zearing when the accident occurred.

Lived in Zearing.

Andrews is survived by his father, Thomas C. Andrews, St. Anthon, Ia., a brother, Herbert J. Andrews and a sister, Mrs. Cecil Hall, both of Clemons, Ia. He lived in Zearing with an aunt, and had been making his living cutting and selling wood.

Burial will be near Zearing. See is survived by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Frank See, and three brothers, Richard, Merie and Kenneth, all residing at home.

After investigating the accident Chester William Carpenter said no inquiry would be held.
